Prayer of Illumination

Both passages from the Old and New Testament speak of a King who brings life to the world; a king like no other who brings freedom, hope, love and joy. Holy One: open these scriptures to our minds, own hearts and our lives. AMEN

First Reading: Zachariah 9:9-10

Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

All: Thanks be to God for the Word

Responsive Reading of Luke 19:28-46

One: ²⁸⁻³¹ Jesus headed straight up to Jerusalem. When he got near Bethphage and Bethany at the mountain called Olives, he sent off two of the disciples with instructions: “Go to the village across from you. As soon as you enter, you’ll find a colt tethered, one that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it. If anyone says anything, asks, ‘What are you doing?’ say, ‘His Master needs him.’”

All: ³²⁻³³ **The two left and found it just as he said. As they were untying the colt, its owners said, “What are you doing untying the colt?”** ³⁴ **They said, “His Master needs him.”**

One: ³⁵⁻³⁶ They brought the colt to Jesus. Then, throwing their coats on its back, they helped Jesus get on. As he rode, the people gave him a grand welcome, throwing their coats on the street.³⁷⁻³⁸ Right at the crest, where Mount Olives begins its descent, the whole crowd of disciples burst into enthusiastic praise over all the mighty works they had witnessed:

**All: Blessed is he who comes, the king in God’s name!
All’s well in heaven! Glory in the high places!**

One: Some Pharisees from the crowd told him, “Teacher, get your disciples under control!”

All: ⁴⁰ **But he said, “If they kept quiet, the stones would do it for them, shouting praise.”**

One: ⁴⁵⁻⁴⁶ Going into the Temple he began to throw out everyone who had set up shop, selling everything and anything. He said, "It's written in Scripture,

All: **My house is a house of prayer; You have turned it into a religious bazaar."**
